

Ogden After Hours O-riginal Art Activity:

Paper Sculpture Inspired by Lin Emery



Lin Emery, *Mitre*, aluminum, Gift of Pat and Denver Gray

Lin Emery is an internationally recognized sculptor. Her kinetic sculptures produce constantly changing relationships through the ever-varying configuration of their parts. Lin Emery's forms are abstracted from nature and give visible form to the energies moving through nature.

Supplies:

Sliver cardstock, Brass fasteners, Scissors, Yogurt cup, Wooden dowel, Stapler/Staples, Aluminum foil, Hole puncher

Instructions:

Step 1: With the help of an adult make a hole in the bottom of a yogurt cup. Cover the cup with aluminum foil. Put the wooden dowel in the hole.

Step 2: Use scissors to cut out your favorite shape from the silver paper. Cut out more than one of the same shape.

Step 3: To make a kinetic sculpture, use brass fasteners to attach your shapes together to create a larger piece that moves. To make a three dimensional shape, use staples to put two shapes together.

Step 4: Use tape to attach your shapes to the dowel.
