Supplies

Scissors, Glue stick, Cardstock, Pattern Paper or Color Paper

Instructions

Step 1: Look at Michael Eble's artwork, *Celebration.* What shapes, colors and **patterns** do you notice?

Step 2: Think about what colors and shapes you want in your artwork. Artists often use the colors in **abstract** art to express feelings and emotions. How do the colors in Eble's artwork make you feel? What feeling do you want to express? What color makes you think of that feeling?

Step 3: Starting with one color, use scissors to cut out shapes from the pattern paper or color paper. Next, cut out a variety of shapes from paper of different colors and patterns.

Step 4: Think about how you want to arrange the shapes in your **collage**. Once you have decided on the **composition** of your artwork, use a glue stick to create your collage.

Vocabulary

Abstract - an artwork that is comprised of shapes and colors

Pattern - a repetition of specific visual elements in art

Composition - is the arrangement of elements within an artwork

Collage - a technique using cut or torn fabric or paper and glue
